## **OPEN SESSION-MINUTES**

The Public Meeting was called to order by Dr. Porter at precisely 10:00 AM via ZOOM with a welcome of guests. Noted here that 24 attendees were present on ZOOM. Board Members attested to their presence via a roll call by Dr. Porter. Dr. Moore, Dr. Smith, Dr. Zimmerman, Dr. Porter, Dr. Williams, Dr. Grubbs, and Ms. Birmingham all attested to their presence. Keeler, DDS, a Mississippi Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeon requesting the ability to return to General Practice. Dr. Porter discussed the issues at-hand. (Exhibits attached.) After much discussion by all Board Members, it was determined that Dr. Keeler would be allowed to convert his specialty license in Oral Surgery to an inactive status.
